



President's Report

In my last column I gave some indication that BAWA was close to securing a permanent

home I also promised some more detail soon. I am delighted to be able to report significant progress. Currently BAWA spends around \$30 000 annually renting premises in which to hold bridge events. Current rental agreements run for a 3 year period and are dependent on clubs tendering to host evening state events. ABF licensed event accommodation is negotiated on an annual basis.

Melville Bridge Club has been offered by the Melville City Council, who wishes to redevelop the land on which the current club is situated, relocation and a new club house. During the process of negotiations BAWA became involved with the view to being a part of this development.

The council have now offered Melville Bridge Club a 60 table venue if BAWA were included in the development or a smaller (40 table) venue should BAWA not be included. This venue, located near the Atwell Gallery in Alfred Cove, will be offered to the club on a 21 year lease. I have seen the plans and it looks like an outstanding bridge club.

Melville has generously offered BAWA a tenancy within the venue for the full period of 21 years for a cost of around \$15,000 per annum with CPI based adjustments. The final figure will be decided after a detailed agreement is reached however; it is not expected to change

significantly. Over the lease period this represents a saving to BAWA in excess of \$300 000.00.

The tenancy agreement, with minor details to be finalized, will allow BAWA access to the venue for all BAWA and BAWA/ABF events along with office and storage space. In addition; access to meeting rooms, a place to display the BAWA honour boards and signage.

Furthermore, BAWA would operate precisely as it does now as a fully autonomous entity with no overt advantage offered to Melville Bridge and no disadvantage to any other of our affiliates. Effectively we are moving from a rolling 3 year lease to a 21 year lease which is fantastic in terms of the long term security of BAWA.

There is some concern that holding all evening state events at the one south of the river venue may discourage some state players from entering state events. Whilst I don't consider this to be the case we will be giving serious thought to the idea that possibly Monday night events will stay at a north of the river location for a least a couple of years.

Such a significant venture will, naturally, require the OK from the BAWA Council. Consequently, I have asked the BAWA XO to convene a Special General Meeting next month I hope that as many clubs as possible are able to attend.

Undercroft Bridge Club




For three weeks in June we held the **DON FRASER SWISS PAIRS** event, with 34 pairs taking part. Bill Kemp directed and everything ran smoothly.

Playing Bridge at the Geraldton Congress



Living in Mandurah we are 45 minutes behind the "eight ball" when it comes to travelling to Geraldton so when we were asked to make up a team for the Geraldton congress 488kms from Madora Bay seemed such a long way. However we decided to accept the challenge. I checked out Google maps and asked a few people the best route to take considering there is a new way via the coast called Indian Ocean Drive rather than the regular Brand Highway.

The consensus was the coastal route gave fabulous views over the ocean and the entire trip was broken up by the various coastal settlements. Bridge commenced but it wasn't to be our night. I think every pair who crossed our table bid and made their unstoppable games and even slams. We were belted up but things changed the next day in the open pairs. This time we received the cards, played some good bridge and had some luck eventually running out comfortable E/W winners, but not before this hand came along.

Our opponents were Marcey Spilsbury and Gwen Wiles from WABC.




Sitting East, I opened 2C. The purists will shake their heads in disbelief but everyone isentitled to their own system and style. Our style is to show the 5 losers and 6 card suit and that's what I have. Marcey sitting South X'd, Kathy passed and Gwen sitting North bid 2D. I now bid 2H showing my 6 card suit and 5 losers. Marcey jumped to 4D and Kathy came in with 4H. Gwen 5D. Since I have no defence to a D contract I bid 5H and with her void in H's Marcey went to 6D which was doubled by Kathy. As we had pushed our opps to a cold slam in D's ,6H is a good sacrifice, but I sat tight confident of picking up a score. Try as we might, Gwen Wiles was too good for us and played the hand superbly bringing the contract home. Not only had we given them a top board but also bragging rights for the rest of the evening at a local restaurant.

We met again in round 5 of the teams event and

Marcey sitting South opened 1H, Kathy with her nice hand decided to 'sit on the fence' and see what transpired. Gwen sitting north bid 1S. Sitting East I am thinking that should Marcey support spades I will be nicely placed but I decided Kathy might like some sort of lead direction so I overcalled 2C. Marcey duly supported Gwen's spades. The contract was now 3S. Kathy decided that she had lovely support for clubs and with her void in spades considered that IF 4S was making, 5C would go close or be a good sacrifice. The contract was now 5C. Her partner had opened and Gwen had the AH and K of my suit so a double hit the table. Marcey started with a regulation AS which I ruffed in dummy and led down to my singleton IH. Gwen rose with AH and returned a D to Marcey's QD and Dummies AD. I dropped 2 spades under the KQ of hearts and played a D to my 9 and Marcey's KD. A heart was returned and ruffed in hand. I ruffed a spade in dummy and played the winning JD dropping my last spade. Now I took the marked club finesse and the contract was home. Gwen graciously said "well done, you got us back". Our team mates, Linda Bedford-Brown and Robin Paterson were in fact in 4S for -200 but our +550 won the board.

In my opinion the Geraldton members went close to knocking the Albany Club off their mantle as best country cooks. The home cooked food was not only plentiful but outstanding in the variety presented. In fact if it was a teams match it would be as close to a draw as one could get. Well done Geraldton.

PS - We arrived back in the Perth metro area at the Freeway entrance and Kathy said "Look there!" 2 cars in front was the director of the day Peter Holloway. I thought we were pretty much the first car out of the driveway in Geraldton so how did he get in front of us? Kathy's replied "I


♦ AQJ2 **♥** 8765432 **♦** K7 **♣**

Occasionally, everyone perpetrates a particularly poor decision leading to a particularly poor result on a deal. It can be a little humiliating: to offset this humiliation, one can always reflect on the following deal, played in the full glare of a Bermuda Bowl semi-final.

This is not a particularly swingy layout. 4H by N/S will probably fail, maybe doubled, on the bad breaks. That's what happened in the USA – Taipei semi-final: Taipei were in 4H doubled down one, whilst USA rested in 2H in the other room, for 9 imps.

In the England – Sweden match, Jeremy Flint made a peaceful 3D as West. But the Open Room had fireworks:

In 3NT, Fallenius took four tricks – a penalty of 2800 points, the largest ever in a Bermuda Bowl match, and a 21 imp loss.

Predictably, this was a devastating blow to the morale, and Sweden eventually lost the match by 47 imps.

The moral? Not much – but if partner does insist that you take preference, then maybe you should do so. On this layout, 4D takes 8 or 9 tricks.



You have a safe lead with the JD, but should you be thinking of safety? Wouldn't you like to put partner on lead to give you a club ruff? How can partner gain the lead?

What do you think North's jump to 5H means? Does it sound as though North is looking for strong hearts from partner? Or is North showing a hand too good for 4H? Or does North have superb hearts and is seeking spade control from South?

The last interpretation is by far the more common in a competitive auction. If so, North's pass of 5H is telltale. North does not have the SK otherwise North should have raised to 6H. That places partner with the SK and a low spade is a reasonable start, as neither North nor South figure to have a singleton spade if your interpretation of 5H is correct.

Is there any danger in leading a low spade? You could find partner doing the wrong thing in this position:


If you lead low and declarer plays low from dummy, partner might insert the 10. Oops.

If you lead low and declarer plays low in dummy, partner might duck, playing South for the SA bare.

If you are right that neither North nor South has a singleton spade and that partner has the SK, then it cannot hurt to start with the SA. If you do opt for a low spade lead, it should be the S2, suitpreference signal for a club return.

The oppositions bidding often gives away their lack of stoppers or controls. Always try to deduce what their auction means and see what follows from that.

This deal arose in the 2002 McConnell Cup (World Women's Teams):



At the table West led the DJ and declarer made thirteen tricks. No swing as 4H scored 710 at the other table. If West did lead a low spade, would East play the SK or would East think West might have started with SJ-x-x-x-x-x?

In other matches a diamond was led against, 5H vs 6H, 5H vs 7NT and 4H vs 6H. Thus every slam made and every declarer had thirteen tricks on a deal where declarer can be held to nine tricks: SA led, second spade (S2) to the SK, club ruff and a diamond exit.



ROVING RHODES

Glorious Geraldton

Here is a board from the Teams event at the recent Geraldton Congress, which I think you may find interesting. What would you bid after your right hand opponent opens the bidding with a weak 2H bid? Nobody is vulnerable.

♦ Q84 ♥ 5 **♦** AKQ654 **♣** KQ2



Now back to the hand, I showed you- what action did you decide to take after the weak Two Hearts opening? Well, of course, it depends upon your partnership agreements, but I overcalled 3H, which asks Partner to bid 3NT if he has the Hearts stopped. On this hand, X would have worked as well, but I believe that the stopperasking bid is the best with such a long, strong minor.

Here are the full hands:



As you can see, 3NT made easily, as did 4S, but 5 Diamonds goes one off, which is what happened at the other table. Nine tricks are easier to make than eleven!


