President's Report

As foreshadowed in last month's column BAWA has determined that in 2015

State events will be played primarily on Thursday evenings – most likely at a number of venues. There is no doubt that, whilst across the board table numbers are healthy, evening events are suffering. Whatever the reasons, and there are a number, players are opting to play during the day. Naturally, BAWA will be continuing to hold major state championships at an evening session to allow working players the opportunity to play high quality competitive bridge.

The 2015 draft calendar has been published on our website and you will notice not only a number of daytime events but an increased number of Restricted Events. Over 80% of players have less than 300 master points and are therefore eligible to play. Sandy Sutton-Mattocks has taken over the role of promoting these events and will be busy next year encouraging YOU to play.

There are, of course, two "restricted style" events left for this year. The **Masters in Teams of 3** where 3 players with less than 300 master points (as of January 1 2014) enter as a team and I will find you a Grand Master to join your team for the day. The other event is the **Grand Master-Restricted Pairs** where you find a partner of the appropriate ranking and enter the 2 week event in November. Incidentally, I am pleased to see table numbers for both events looking healthy even though they are a few weeks away. Full details can be found on the BAWA web site.

Not so healthy are the table numbers for the **Super Vets Congress** which is in danger of being

cancelled – so if you have an intention to enter – be quick. I would hope that clubs are helping their Super Vets to play.

Congratulations to the winners and to Sheenagh Young and her team for a great **HGR Memorial Weekend**. Well done all of the 0-300 players who played – 17 tables was a great turnout.

Very exciting news from the Melville City Council and the Melville Bridge Club, the latest meeting saw the approval of final plans for the new centre and a strong commitment from the Mayor to have the project finished within his term of office. This, incidentally, is 2 years.

BAWA wishes to welcome the Denmark Bridge Club to the family – more later.

Thank you to members who helped out on Tuesday afternoon. The Silver Chain ladies came along again and helped out with lunches which they have done since the beginning of this event in 2000.

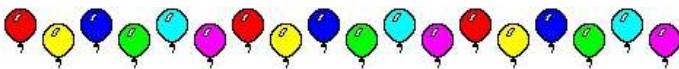
The cakes were just so beautiful. Well done to the cooks.

Things I have seen ... (1)

By Matt McManus

Being the director usually means that you often don't get to see what happens at the table. Unless something significant has come up resulting in a director call, he will not normally know about any of the "interesting" hands that arise. Over the next few articles I will describe some of the more unusual scenarios which I have observed while directing. Next time, I will look at a couple of examples where the normal and correct application of the laws results in some extreme outcomes, but this time, here a few examples which were just plain "weird".

After an auction which probably doesn't bear repeating, West became the declarer in 3HX. Because of some infraction during the auction, I was called to the table and it was necessary for me to watch the play in case it was relevant to the eventual ruling. That's how I came to be able to report this hand. The opening lead was DK, taken by declarer's ace, who then probably did best by setting up his rather good spade side suit. North ducked his ace, so dummy's SJ won. Seeing it was South who had doubled, declarer now took the very deep, but maybe not unreasonable line, of running East's H7. From this point on, trumps were never led again. H7 lost to North's singleton 9 and now declarer was in big trouble. However, North let him off the hook by exiting with C10. Winning CJ in dummy meant that there were no club losers. West now tried to cash his CAK, but South ruffed the second round. A spade to North's ace established the side suit. A diamond was led and ruffed in dummy to leave the following

ending. At this point, the defence has won three tricks.

Declarer led a spade ruffed by South who exited with DJ. Declarer could see nothing better to do than ruffing this in dummy then ruffing a club in his hand. He then led another spade. South ruffed with HJ to leave this rather amazing suit combination at Trick 13.

Non-Expert Play at Trick 1

The next hand featured a very regular partnership, which have played together for a long time. Why that is the case is a bit of a mystery. The North player never seems to be happy and spends a lot of the time at the end of each hand/round/session berating his partner for some perceived deficit in her skill or execution. (Some less kind players have questioned whether they are – or should be – married!) South just sits back and accepts it. It also appears that North is the type who likes to hog the bidding. He is declarer a lot of the time. And I wonder whether they don't have some

“rules” to ensure that this is the case. One of these “rules” might be that if ever the opportunity arises, the “better” player, that is North, must be the declarer. A classic case where this could crop up is when there is an opening lead out of turn. And so I observed the following:

East was not a very experienced player and in his excitement at holding an ace against a grand slam, he led it. I was called to the table and explained the opening lead out of turn options to South:

- i. accept the lead, make themselves the dummy and let partner play the hand;
- ii. accept the lead, dummy comes down and they play next from their own hand;
- iii. demand a spade lead from West;
- iv. prohibit a spade lead from West;
- v. leave SA as a penalty card and allow West to lead what they like – on a spade lead the ace would have to be played.

It can be seen that only option (iv) gives NS any chance in this contract. If declarer guesses to play diamonds correctly they can come to thirteen with seven diamonds, three hearts and three clubs. At the table, however, South, perhaps mindful of her partner’s insistence that he was the better player and should always be declarer, accepted the lead and made herself dummy. It was one of the few times where I saw North unusually silent at the end of the hand!

I knew he probably had no hearts but to his credit he passed, saying something like you have to trust your partner and proceeded to make it with ease. We got 16 for that round but still coming about 3rd. everything hinged on the last match. It was so exhilarating to play with someone of that standard. I was on fire.

Everything seemed to go right and our partners at the other table did well too and we got 20 on that round and just managed to pip both the Booth and Law teams. I was chuffed when Nigel was giving a speech at the Awards night and he said it was one event he had never won and had always wanted to. I can't speak highly enough of the boost to your bridge and your bridge confidence by entering one of these events.

The Mystery of the Orange, the Colonel and the Nine of Spades

The question is "What do the Orange, the Colonel and the Nine of Spades have in common? Well, you can stop racking your brains, it's "The PIPS".

You might ask yourself what is all this to do with bridge? The story goes like this:

Once upon a time, there was a bridge player from Mars. The little red man was on lead, defending the contract of 3NT, played by East. South's hand was atrocious. He held a five card spade suit, 9 high, with one side suit entry, so he decided to lead off with the S4. Dummy was laid bare, showing off her doubleton J10 of spades. North was very hopeful, sitting there with AQ8, the Venusian couldn't wait to unblock the spade suit for her partner. First the Ace, then the Queen. East's King took the second trick and then declarer proceeded to cash as many tricks as possible eventually losing to South - the danger hand. This is where the Martian had an outer space moment. Dummy's original holding of the J10 spade doubleton had been out of his orbit and so the S7 hit the table, throwing North in with their 8S, end playing North, who had no good exit card. The final result - 3NT making 10 tricks, instead of -1 and a top board for the Defence.

The moral to this story, whether you are an orange, a Colonel or a Bridge Player, watch out for the PIPS. If you have a momentary glitch, play your highest card. You might find that you will have landed yourself a great score.

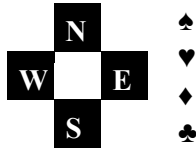

What's going on here? West, holding DJ, could have easily locked you in dummy by playing a heart. You would have had no entry to your hand

to take the spade finesse. It's almost as if West wants you to take the spade finesse.

Take a peep at West. Does he or she look at all intelligent? If so, refuse the Greek gift of an entry to your hand, and bang down the ace and king of spades.

The moral: It pays to know your customer.

After the S3 lead to the king, East switched to the H6: three – king – four. A second spade would now defeat 5C, but West returned the H5. If South had chosen 3NT, a brave move, it would have been successful. After West's heart return at trick

3 South can make 5C: win HQ, finesse CQ, D5 to dummy, finesse CJ, cash CA, and run the diamonds. South played the H8 from dummy and could have survived via HA and using diamonds as the entries to dummy for two club finesses.

When he won trick 3 with the H9, he was doomed. He ruffed a spade in dummy and played the H10, ruffed. The result was two down, -100.
