

President's Report

Having just read the last couple of Focus columns where I have confidently forecast the running of several events, none of which eventuated, I've decided to give up making any predictions during this challenging and continually evolving crisis. After my assertion that the Swan River would run, it was a tough call to cancel; but the decision was made with the best interests of West Australian bridge players foremost in our thinking.

Having said that I'm going to give up making predictions, here are a couple. Given that we continue to have no community transmission of the COVID19 virus in WA, BAWA is moderately confident that the HGR Women's Swiss Pairs and the HGR Restricted Swiss pairs will run. The expected numbers are well within limits imposed by WA Phase 4 Restrictions.

The table number limit for The Golden West has been reduced to 49 tables, and, once again, if conditions continue to be favourable, we fully expect this event to run. We are lowering entrant numbers by natural attrition; however, it would help if you have a TBA that you advise the Tournament Organiser, Allison Stralow of your partner as soon as possible.

The bridge regulations and calendar aspects of Club congresses are the responsibility of BAWA; everything else is entirely the concern of the clubs. BAWA has no say as to whether or not a club decides to cancel or postpone any of their events. I fully understand and support clubs who make these difficult decisions; I also fully support our directors who are justifiably concerned about officiating at such events.

I am delighted at the success of our two daytime events held so far this year. They have been, within restrictions, fully subscribed and we did welcome some new faces to state level bridge. I am sure that there will be a number of daytime events on the 2021 calendar. There you go - another prediction.

Major Items and Decisions

Retiring and new ABF Councillor

ABF Councillors are an integral part of the administration of Australian bridge. Thank you to retiring councillor, Therese Tully for her service to the Queensland Bridge Association and the ABF. We welcome Charles Page who is the new QBA member to Council and we look forward to his contributions in the year to come.

Remuneration for Tournament Officials at ABF and other National Events

Following a review of the 2017 policy on baseline remuneration for tournament officials at ABF and ABF Licensed events, the ABF Management Committee agreed to update the policy. The recommended increases in remuneration will take effect from January 2021.

ABF BBO Games

In response to player feedback the ABF has decided to run a second Nationwide Online Pairs session each week.

The new session on Friday evenings at 7:30pm AEST commenced on August 14th.

The Nationwide sessions continue on Sunday afternoon beginning at 2.30pm AEST. The Management Committee is pleased to see 600+ players, playing in either the Open, Restricted or Novice event. ABF Youth BBO sessions will begin shortly and all youth players are encouraged to participate.

Plans for ABF and ABF Licensed Events to September 2020 – February 2021

The resumption of national events remains uncertain and we will continue to monitor the situation closely.

A decision on the Summer Festival of Bridge and Youth Week 2021 will be made at the MC meeting in September. It was also decided to set the 31st December as the date to determine if planning for the ANC, 2021 in Orange, N.S.W. will proceed.

SESSION TIMES RETURN TO NORMAL

It was decided to go back to regular sessions and allow non-members to attend from 1st August. The playing area has also been opened up to our permitted 50 tables. Please note that at the Monday and Friday morning sessions only 24 boards will be played to ensure no crossover between sessions. The Wednesday session has the earlier starting time of 11am finishing at 2.30pm.

The Management Committee continue to insist on a high standard of hygiene and social distancing whilst at the Club, in accordance with Government guidelines, ensuring the safest environment is available to all. These are simple rules designed to keep everyone who attends the club as safe as possible and we thank you all for looking after your own health and that of fellow players.

Hand sanitising stations have been placed just inside the entrance doors so players can wash hands on entering the building. Two sanitization bottles are provided at each table, ready for use prior to commencement of each set of boards.

Pre-paid vouchers, in blocks of 10, have been available for members to purchase via EFTPOS and the system will be continued as it has proven convenient for many people. The usual payment of cash at the table is still available for both visitors and members.

The bar has re-opened and everyone is welcome to stay for a drink following afternoon sessions.

COMPETITIONS

Since the re-opening of the Club, apart from regular duplicate sessions, there have been no major competitions.

One unique opportunity is our Grand National Open Teams Event starting in early September. This has proven extremely popular, with only a few places still available. This is a stand-alone event, due to the cancellation of State and National Finals, and will be played over 3 weeks with Gold Points awarded.

Due to cancellation of events earlier in the year September has become a busy month with many Championship events to be held. These include the Mixed Pairs, Open Teams, Restricted Teams and Men's Pairs. The Evening Pairs Championship will be played in October.

There will be no club bridge at WABC on Saturday 19 September if the ABF Hans Rosendorff Tournament goes ahead.

On the Queen's Birthday holiday Monday there will be red point duplicate games for both morning and afternoon sessions. Take note that the morning session begins at the slightly later time of 9.15am, with the usual start time of 1.15pm for the afternoon game.

At 1pm on Tuesday, 13 October there will be another Red Point event prior to the WABC Annual General Meeting which will follow at 4.30pm.

ANDY HUNG'S LESSONS

Actually, we have had it good, and the only thing that I missed was playing "real bridge". Never even played a single session on line, mostly because I could not commit to a specific time every day and also do not like it! So, it was great getting back on July 30th (missing my daughter's birthday dinner) for the Swiss pairs and on August 4th for the Daytime pairs. What a splendid field for a Daytime event.

There were two interesting slams B 22 with a combined holding of 35 points, and 27 had a combined holding of 26 points. You needed to find the spade queen for the Grand on 22.

The holdings were East KJ98, A2, AKQ4, 1097, opposite A106, KQJ3. J102. AK9. Surely after any 1NT, or strong club opening, west will be

investigation for a Grand Slam. Also, after an Acol NT response showing 15 -18.

Board 27 was probably more difficult after a 3C opening by South. Too risky to use Leaping Michaels, but a 3S overcall should be acceptable particularly as you have a second suit. Six out of 16 pairs bid to 6S, and one even tried for the grand slam. (Hairy trying to find the queen of diamonds, but in this case successful)

What would be your preferred plan for bidding after 3C - 3S by partner? Most seemed to prefer 4NT. Partner shows two keycards, with the gueen of trumps. 5NT, have you any kings? Now it is a question of style. Do you show specific aces: the number of aces, or return to the suit that you are playing in, to deny any kings? This was an undiscussed situation, and over my 5NT, Cynthia Belonogoff, bid 6S. Now, totally stuffing it up, I decided to bid 7S. This was such a bad bid, by me but we also needed some points, and it was the last hand too. Most of you know that Cynthia is quite stoic and inscrutable at the table. After the lead of the heart king she took stock. Then winning the heart she ruffed one immediately. To dummy with the king of spades to ruff another heart. Now she drew trumps and neither opponent had any problems discarding clubs and hearts. What she did know was that south had 7 clubs, one spade and at least three hearts. Then came the ace of diamonds followed by a low diamond. What would you play from dummy? She felt that north had at least two clubs, or was likely to have led a singleton: three spades, and obviously longer hearts. The moment of truth had arrived. My instinct was to take the finesse, but Cynthia judged correctly, playing the king and dropping the queen for our only clear top.

How about a different bidding sequence? Opening 3C: 3S: 4C – Cue. 4D -- Cue. 4H – Cue. 5H – second round control in hearts. 6D – second round control in diamonds. West has nothing extra to show and will probably bid 6S, where I believe that is where we should have stopped.

In conclusion, like all of you, we had to cancel all holiday plans, so my wife told our suitcases that we are not taking them anywhere this year, so now we are dealing with emotional baggage!



Mnemonics and Maxims

By Di Brooks

I'm sure, by now, regular Focus readers know how I love Mnemonics and Maxims ... So not to disappoint, here's another couple of my favourites

#1 High Card from the Short Side: this is unblocking a suit, so declarer can get the full benefit of playing a long suit. For example: -

K96 opposite AQJ 532

New students of contract bridge get excited seeing so many high cards in one suit and will cash the A,Q and then over to the K, leaving three winners in the other hand ... and guess what?? No entry to that hand. This is an easy example to understand but there are many more which a new player might miss.

#2 The lead from the defence is the Ace and declarer holds Kx. Dummy's hand hits the table and it's absolute garbage, (as some Dummy's are wont to do!!)

Dummy holds: -

0I976 in the suit led

Declarer has to make an executive decision, if he automatically plays small from Dummy and small from his hand, he may never get another opportunity to enter Dummy. Here is his chance to unblock by playing the King under the opponent's Ace.

#3 Declarer has opened with 1C, partner responds 1D, Declarer now bids 1H. The final contract, 4H

The lead is AD. Dummy shows up with Q10965 and Declarer needs to stop the continuation of the diamond lead, in case West, the leader, is sitting with Axxxx and is hoping East is sat with a singleton diamond. Declarer holds KJ bare in Diamonds. If he hesitates to decide which card to play, West knows to continue the suit. But if Declarer SMOOTHLY, at the same speed as his usual play, drops the King under the opponent's Ace, this might stop the defence in trumping the continuation. Another chance to UNBLOCK. High

Card from the Short Side - only this time, to create the illusion of holding a singleton in that suit.






Test Your Slam Play

SOLUTION



You could unblock the spades and play a third round of trumps to dummy's king. Then if the *K and *Q stand up, you have 12 tricks. Of course, the bad break in hearts makes it more likely that there will also be a bad break in one of the black suits, so this approach is not without risk.

And there is a superior play, which depends only on the diamonds not dividing 5-0. Play ♥A and

draw East's last trump. Now unblock the $\triangle A$ and $\triangle K$.

Finally, the pièce de résistance. Play •A and then a low diamond. The opponent who wins this will either have to play to dummy's winners, or lead a diamond back into your suit.

The moral: Before playing a good line, it's worth checking to see if there's a better one.



East's best chance for a good result is a subterfuge. Take the HK with the HA and return the H2. West wins and plays a third heart. Both West and South share the illusion that you began with a doubleton. When declarer ruffs high in dummy, you will come to a trump trick and declarer will be one down. East's play here applies whether it is teams or pairs.
